

Lost property at the end of term


As we are rapidly approaching the end of this half term, we would like to encourage all students to check the lost property for their belongings.

Team Mathematics Challenge



Last week we took part in the UKMT Team Mathematics Challenge at Wilson's School. Representing our School, we had Jia Xin (8Cur), Katrina (9Cur), Mira (9Sea) and Mugdha (8Bro). This is a team competition in which our students were competing against 18 other schools over four different rounds. We had a brilliant day and everyone enjoyed themselves. We were very excited to have achieved full marks in the first round in which we worked as a team of four to answer questions. The second round was a "cross number" puzzle where we split into two pairs and had to separately tackle across/down questions of a crossword filled with numbers. Although it seemed impossible at first, we were able to work logically to complete is and were excited to be announced in the top five schools after this round. The other two rounds were relays where we had to race to complete questions and rely on our team members to work quickly and accurately. Overall, we did very well and achieved 8th place.

Junior Mathematical Challenge

This term students from years 7 and 8 took park in the Junior Mathematical Challenge. This is a multiple-choice test that is sat by students across the UK. It encourages mathematical reasoning, precision of thought, and fluency in using basic mathematical techniques to solve interesting problems. The problems are challenging and designed to make even the most able students think!

The competition was tough this year and the thresholds for certificates were 86+ for Gold, 70+ for Silver and 57+ for Bronze. A score of 92+ meant a student would qualify to sit the Junior Kangaroo and a score of 123+ meant a student would qualify to sit the Junior Mathematical Olympiad.

It is a great achievement to have been awarded a certificate and we would like to congratulate and celebrate the success of the following students.



Punctuality

Good punctuality to both lessons and to school is expected of all students. We know that employers place great importance on punctuality and attendance, therefore it is important for our students to understand the value of being on time.

WHSG will issue same day, 20 min detentions for students that are late into school, without a valid reason or persistent lateness to classes. Parents and students will be notified as soon as possible of the detention and the reasoning by email.

We ask that parents support these actions as important processes for the school and understand that detentions cannot be moved for any after school clubs or enrichment events. Should a detention clash with a medical appointment, evidence will be requested for the school to show flexibility.
