Grooming is often associated with sexual grooming, but as we all know the process of grooming can be used for a multitude of crimes where children and young people can be exploited, such as county lines. County lines is also a form of criminal exploitation that typically relies on older gang members grooming children from inner-city areas. However, research from The Commission on Young Lives found that criminals also groom children from "suburban and middle-class England."

Internet Matters have put together a really useful guide for parents explaining county lines, how children are targeted, how children may be vulnerable and some resources/support.


Houston, We Have an Eclipse!

Punctuality

Good punctuality to both lessons and to school is expected of all students. We know that employers place great importance on punctuality and attendance, therefore it is important for our students to understand the value of being on time.
