### Message from the Headteacher



The KS3 music concert was another triumph for all those who took part. With a variety of performances, the standard was incredibly high, and I felt privileged to be in the audience of such talented musicians. Well done to all performers. I fully appreciate how much practice goes in to being so good. On that note, we say thank you and goodbye to Mrs. Yard this week, who has been with us covering for a maternity leave. Mrs. Yard has worked exceptionally hard for all our students, and we are incredibly grateful for her dedication. Mrs. Ngobi will be returning soon as the Head of the music department.

As Year 8 students move into Year 9, I would like to remind you that all students in Year 7, 8 and 9 must not have a smartphone in school from September.

We welcome our new parents to our welcome BBQ run by the PFA on Saturday 6th July. I will be in Birmingham with our Gospel Choir but Jennifer Smith, our CEO will be there to say hello to new parents. Over the next few weeks, students will see posters advertising the main political parties and the candidates around the school. They will be able to hear from all the candidates in the week beginning the 1st of July to hear their parties' ideas. After that we will have a huge vote as a school and see how our results compare to the national situation! Important points to note: The five parties were chosen as they are the five main parties with the most influence in England. Certain parties, e.g. the SNP, were excluded as they focus on the interests of other nations within the UK, which would likely be less relevant to the school and its students. It's crucial to highlight that the school does not endorse any of these parties and will remain neutral throughout the election period, and that the candidates volunteered for these roles and the parties do not reflect their beliefs.

Twenty-two year 12 humanities students recently attended the 'How the Light Gets in' Philosophy Festival in Hay. The trip provided them with the unique opportunity to engage with leading thinkers, participate in thought provoking discussions and explore a wide range of philosophical and ethical topics. A particular highlight was meeting renowned philosopher Peter Singer, which left the students inspired and with a deeper understanding of contemporary ethical issues. They returned with widened horizons and a renewed passion for learning.

Our first ever Summer Fayre runs on Friday 12th July. As this is the first event of its kind, we are limiting it to a student only event. Please ask if your child is coming and if they have saved up some spending money to enjoy sponging the teachers and other such activities!

This week is CultureFest week where we have a variety of events each day including a variety of workshops, a catwalk and a cultural food festival. This looks to be a great celebration of culture, and very exciting, and I can't wait to see what's on offer.

## Health Psychology Lecture

The Year 12s were treated to a mini-lecture by my old lecturer, Professor Jane Ogden. She praised the students and has said she would return next year so future Psychologists please keep an eye out! Here are Khadijah's thoughts about the lecture: "The health psychology lecture was an insightful talk surrounding a vast range of topics. Some examples of the topics discussed are eating habits and behaviours, communication in consultations, and the real-life applications of this research in helping people struggling with obesity or eating disorders. Professor Ogden started the lecture by introducing health psychology and the biopsychosocial model it follows. It was particularly fascinating hearing her discuss research conducted that explored eating behaviours in different circumstances, which found that we tend to overeat or eat more when watching TV as our mind is not consciously aware of the calories being consumed (as the TV offers a distraction), and this subsequently makes us feel full slower. This is particularly pertinent in helping professionals support people who suffer from eating disorders. This could even be applied to parenting techniques! Professor Ogden also covered communication, citing studies which showed patients feeling much more relaxed in a medical setting when the doctor matches their level of language, and refrains from using medical jargon. This could in turn encourage people to visit the doctors when ill, as they will be less fearful. Overall, I feel the talk was incredibly thoughtful, and made us all think about psychology in a wider setting outside the classroom, and it explored an area of psychology not many people offer much thought to. If there was one thing to remember from the talk, it is that health psychology is NOT the same as clinical psychology! They both explore very different areas, but there can be some overlap in terms of using findings in clinical settings."

## Swimming Success: Anna's Progress Update



Since the last update before the Surrey County Championships in January, Anna has made significant strides in her swimming journey.

Anna qualified for 7 races this year, the most she has ever achieved in her age group: 50 m breaststroke and fly, 100 m

breaststroke, 200 m breaststroke and IM, 400 IM, and 800 free. She reached the finals in the 50 and 100 breaststroke, finishing 6th and 7th, respectively, in a highly competitive field.

In March, Anna competed in two Level 1 galas in Wycombe and Winchester, marking her first time at such a high level outside of Surrey and regional meets. She set several personal bests (PBs), won a bronze medal in the 50m breaststroke at Winchester, and qualified for the regionals in the 50m and 100m breaststroke. She also represented her club in the 400m medley relay at the regionals.

Despite her efforts, Anna did not make the 50m final at the regionals, although she achieved a 3-second PB in the 100 breaststroke relay, which unfortunately didn't count towards national qualifications. In May, she competed in the Romford Level 1 Last Chance National Qualifier, setting a 1-second PB in the 100 breaststroke, ranking her around 100 nationally—a notable achievement. She also won the 50m breaststroke.

At a recent Level 3 gala, Anna achieved PBs in the 100 IM and 100m free, winning gold in the 50 and 100 breaststroke and the 100 IM, plus a bronze in the 100 free.

Anna is now training hard for the final meet in July, aiming for more qualifications for next year's Surrey championships, having already secured times for the 50, 100, and 200 breaststroke.

Swimming remains her main source of relaxation and joy.

Attached is a photo of Anna with her gold medal after the Romford gala in May. We are hopeful she will continue to thrive in swimming.

## Gospel Choir Highlights

Over the past year, our school's gospel choir, composed of students from years 8-13, has had many exciting opportunities to perform and represent our school.

Our first performance was at the 2nd annual Fusion Showcase, featuring a vibrant mix of dance, music, and cultural performances. The atmosphere was incredible, with strong support from students and parents.

We also performed at the school's winter and spring concerts, showcasing our hard work and improving our skills. Additionally, we performed outside the school, including at the Surrey Schools' Concert in Reigate in January, supporting the Children's Trust.

Recently, we had the amazing opportunity to perform at the Music for Youth Regional Festival in Sutton, competing for a spot at the National Festival in Birmingham. After intense rehearsals, we were thrilled to qualify for the National Festival in July. We are now rehearsing diligently, incorporating judges' feedback.

Although our beloved choir leader, Mrs J Yard, is leaving, we will continue to work hard and strive to make her proud. Thank you, Mrs. Yard, for your dedication and support. We will miss you and wish you the best for the future.

## Punctuality

Good punctuality to both lessons and to school is expected of all students. We know that employers place great importance on punctuality and attendance, therefore it is important for our students to understand the value of being on time.

WHSG will issue same day, 20 min detentions for students that are late into school, without a valid reason or persistent lateness to classes. Parents and students will be notified as soon as possible of the detention and the reasoning by email.
