

A few reminders – our Whole School Production runs this week Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, the Year 9 options evening is on Wednesday 12th February. Students will be allowed to wear their own clothes on Friday 14th February, raising money for Place2Be - a children's mental health charity who provide mental health support in schools and our Spring Fair is on 28th Feb from 3.30-6pm.

Each year the Government publishes a document called the Inspection Data Summary Report (IDSR). This document lays out how the school is doing across a range of metrics. In summary the report shows:

 Progress 8 (GCSE): Our Progress 8 score of 0.9 indicates that, on average, our students achieve a grade higher than their peers of similar ability in other schools. This places us in the 97th percentile nationally.

Punctuality

Punctuality Good punctuality to both lessons and to school is expected of all students. We know that employers place great importance on punctuality and attendance, therefore it is important for our students to understand the value of being on time.

WHSG will issue same day, 20 min detentions for students that are late into school, without a valid reason or persistent lateness to classes. Parents and students will be notified as soon as possible of the detention and the reasoning by email.

We ask that parents support these actions as important processes for the school and understand that detentions cannot be moved for any after school clubs or enrichment events. Should a detention clash with a medical appointment, evidence will be requested for the school to show flexibility.
